PURPOSE

Ethics and responsibility go hand-in-hand. Without personal responsibility, ethical codes and roles are merely abstract concepts. Following rules and behaving ethically at work is a choice and a responsibility.

This three-hour workshop will provide an overview and appreciation of the importance of professional ethics in the supervisor/supervisee relationship, the worker/client relationship, and within the organization. Issues related to ethical dilemmas will also be covered, along with strategies for preventing the most common ethics failures in organizations.
